40 Days-February 14 to March 24, 2024

The Fall, 2023 40 Days for Life campaign was quite successful. It ran from September 27 to November 5. Nationwide, there were 501 babies saved. Three individuals who had been working in abortion facilities quit and 2 Clinics closed down. In Santa Rosa, we had people praying for several hours on most days.

The Spring, 2024, 40 Days for Life Campaign begins Wednesday, February 14th (Ash Wednesday) and runs until March 24th. Forty Days is an international movement which now has peaceful prayer vigils at more than 600 sites. World-wide, we help women choose not to have an abortion.


