

# Gideon, David, and Winning the War for Life

A pro-lifer could get discouraged. After years of prayer and toil, we finally elect a pro-life President, who in turn appoints pro-life justices to the SCOTUS, who in turn overthrow Roe vs. Wade, which in turn promised to protect the lives and health and millions of moms and their babies. Then, in a stunning change of heart and policy, this same President effectively tears the pro-life plank out of the GOP platform, declares himself pro-choice, and promises never to sign federal legislation restricting abortion in the states, not a few of which have now amended their constitutions to enshrine a woman's putative right to abort her unborn child.



Yes, a pro-lifer could get discouraged. But think with me for a moment about Gideon, who, with only 300 chosen men, defeated a confederacy of armies as numerous as a swarm of locusts, or about David, who, with five smooth stones slew a giant whose spear was a big as a weaver's beam. What lessons can we learn from these stories, thereby steadying our hearts for the great war for the sanctity of human life?

I offer five brief replies.

*First, that spiritual war is inevitable.* By God's wise decree, in our fallen world, good will (and must) battle against evil to the very end of history, when, at the return of Christ, the good will banish the evil once and for all.

Second, that the tides of the war are inevitable. Sadly, the current FDA refuses to warn women of the dangers of chemical abortion, and under intense pressure, from the government, Walmart, CVS, and Rite Aid have decided to sell the deadly pills. But happily, and under pressure from outspoken pro-lifers, Costco, Safeway, Health-Mart, Albertsons, Kroger's, Sam's Club, and McKesson have (so far) declined to do so. As for the battles, we will win some and we will lose some.

But thirdly, as for the war itself, victory is inevitable. God told Gideon he would prevail, and in that confidence, Gideon fought and won. David, knowing in his knower that the mighty God was with him, ran to the battle and slew the Philistine champion.

Let Planned Parenthood take heed and lay down their arms while there is still time. *Fourthly, that God likes to use the few to* 



*defeat the many, and the small to triumph over the great.* According to PEW Research Center, 63% of Americans believe abortion should be legal in all or most cases, while only 36% say it should be illegal in all or most cases. There is indeed a giant in the land. No matter. The champion of the LORD will keep fighting, and Goliath will surely fall.

British abolitionists, led by Wilberforce, labored most of their lives to turn public opinion against slavery. By God's grace, and through the faithful perseverance of the few and the small, that battle was won.

*Finally, that God likes his people to use unconventional weapons*. For Gideon and David, it was torches, pitchers, trumpets, and five smooth stones. Here are five such stones, placed in our sling by Christ himself: prayer for the miracle of changed hearts; speaking truth with boldness, gentleness, respect, and love; showing such love in helpful acts of mercy and compassion; persevering in all of these amidst the tides of war; and rejoicing in the sovereignty, wisdom, and goodness of the Creator and Redeemer, who stands with the poor and needy, strengthens our hands for battle, and assures us that the war is won.

Yes, in 2025 a pro-lifer could get discouraged. But when tempted to do so, let him remember Gideon and David, and then, with confidence and joy, take up his holy arms and run to the battle and win the war for life.
